

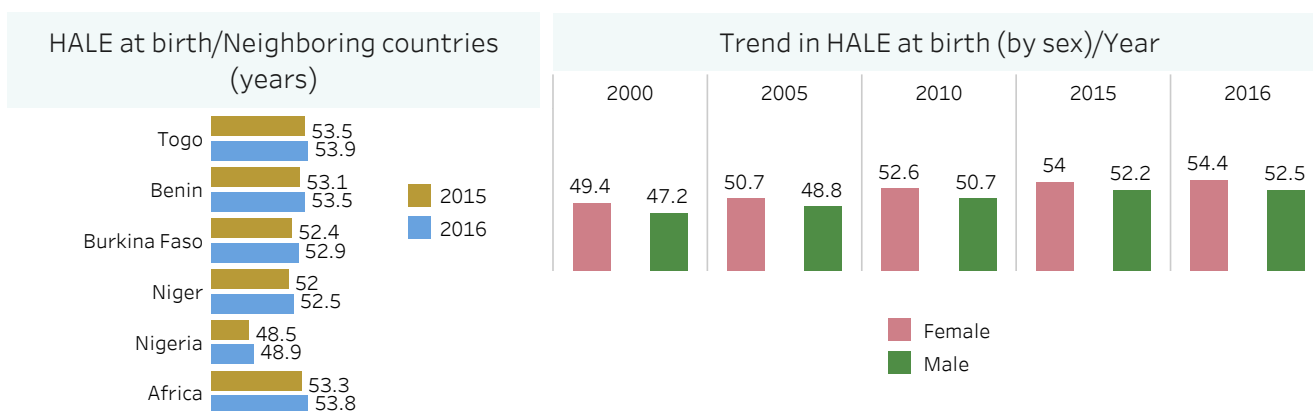
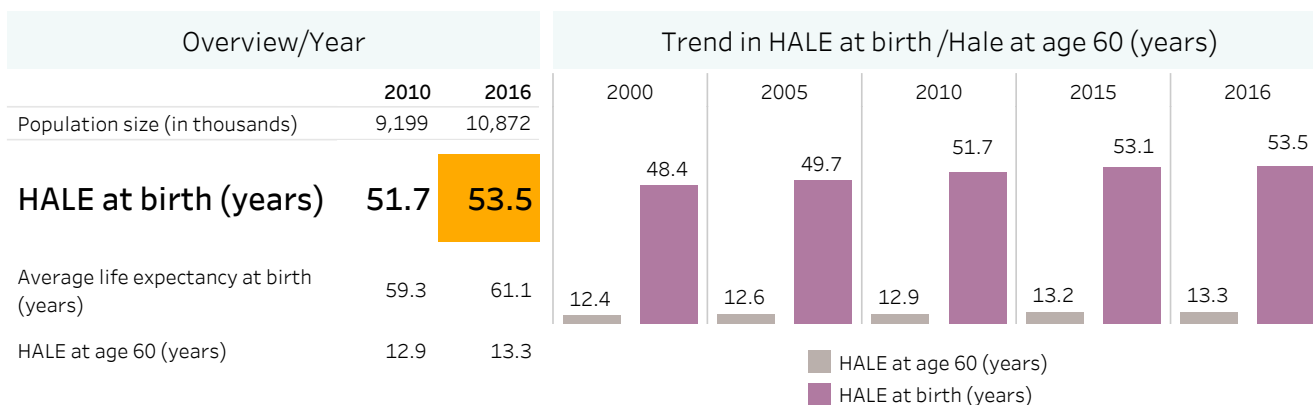
# Healthy average life expectancy (HALE) in Benin

Healthy average life expectancy (HALE) at birth is the average number of years that a person can expect to live in "full health" by taking into account years lived in less than full health due to disease and/or injury. HALE adds up expectation of life for different health states, adjusted for severity distribution making it sensitive to changes over time or differences between countries in the severity distribution of health states.

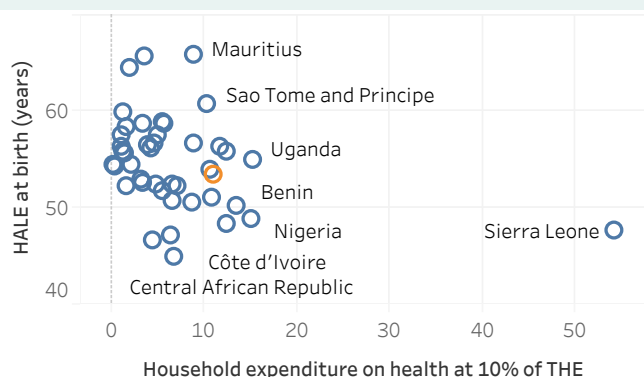
With a weak service coverage index (39.6/100), population in Benin expected to live in average 53.5 years in "full health" in 2016. That represents an increase of about two (2) years compared to the value of 2010. In the period 2000-2016, HALE in Benin seems to increase by about one (1) year each every 3 years.

In Benin, women expect to live at least 2 years longer in "full health" than men (in the period 2000-2016).

Benin was ranked 30 st out of 47 about HALE in the WHO African Region in 2016. However, compared to its neighbors, Benin ranked second behind Togo (53.9) and ahead of Burkina Faso (52.9) in terms of HALE in 2016.
