

Healthy average life expectancy (HALE) in Côte d'Ivoire

Healthy average life expectancy (HALE) at birth is the average number of years that a person can expect to live in "full health" by taking into account years lived in less than full health due to disease and/or injury. HALE adds up expectation of life for different health states, adjusted for severity distribution making it sensitive to changes over time or differences between countries in the severity distribution of health states.

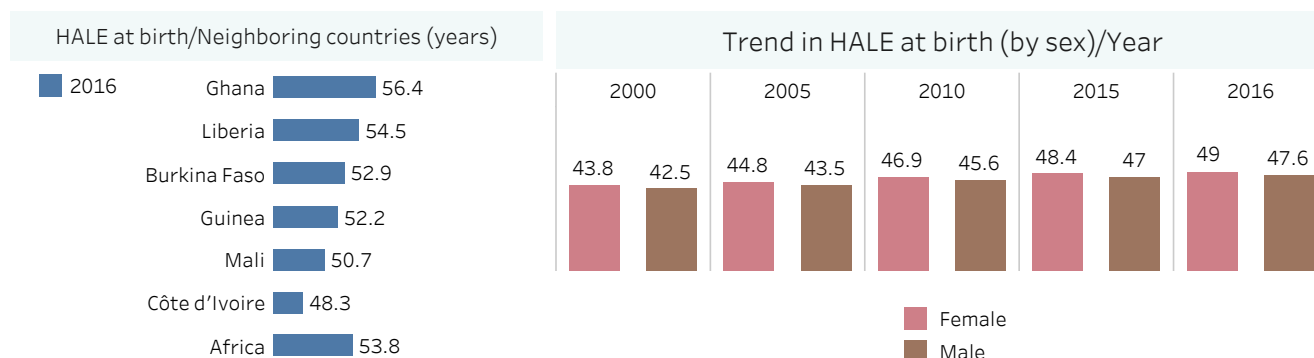
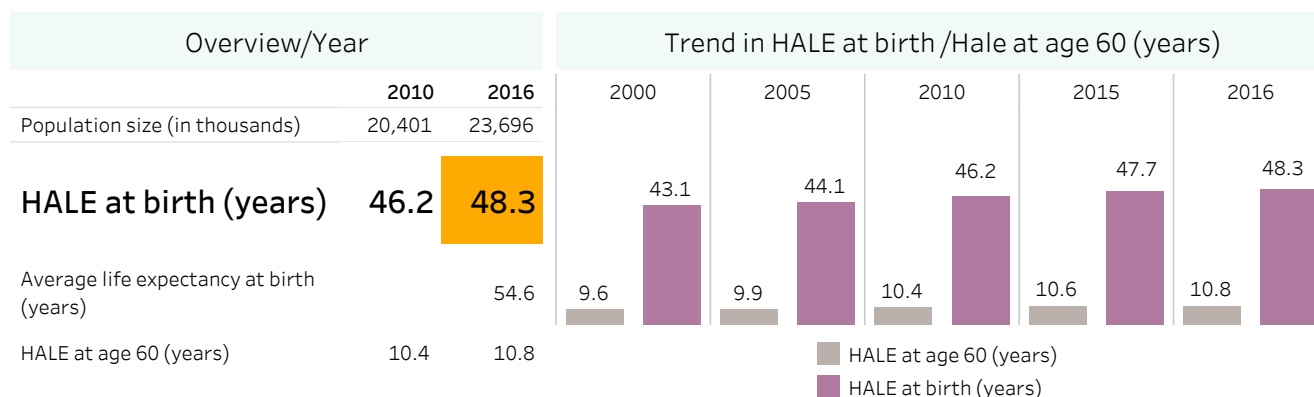
With a weak service coverage index (47.3/100), population in Côte d'Ivoire expected to live in average 48.3 years in "full health" in 2016. That represents an increase of about two (2) years compared to the value of 2010. Over the period 2000-2016, HALE in Côte d'Ivoire seems to increase by about one (1) year each every 3 years.

In Côte d'Ivoire, women seem to live in "full health" one year longer than men (over the period 2000-2016).

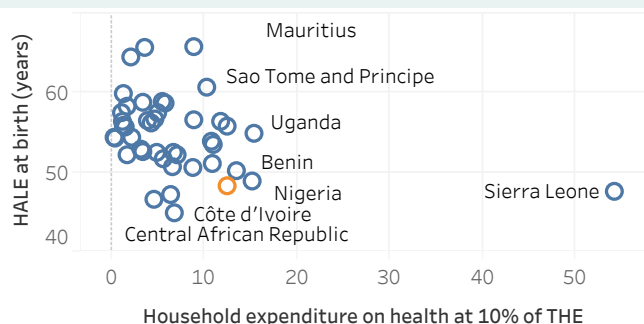
Côte d'Ivoire was ranked 43rd out of 47 for HALE in the African region in 2016. However, compared to its neighbors, Côte d'Ivoire was ranked last behind Mali (50.7 years) and Guinea (52.2 years).
